

The **WOWSA project** (What's on the Web Safe for All Family Members - A Family Learning Approach to Building Digital Literacy Competences) officially started on the 1st of September 2020, so we are now halfway through the project. It's time to take a look at its progress!

WOWSA in a nutshell

WOWSA aims at exploring the relationship with digital and social media that exists within the modern family unit.

The project aims at empowering parents and fostering digital safety through the development of a number of learning resources:

- **Induction to Pedagogy for Parents** - a set of tools aiming to support parents in their role as primary educators of their children and of senior members of their families.
- **Digital Literacy Curriculum for Parents** - including training materials for parents on the topic of digital and media literacy.
- **Family Learning Toolkit** - Comic Strips for children, Interactive Magazines for teenagers and Audio Books for senior adult learners.
- **In-service Training Programme for Adult Educators** - to support their engagement with the new family learning resources developed.

What has been done during this first year?

The partnership has been kept busy with the development of the learning resources:

Induction to Pedagogy for Parents: The training programme is in the finalisation process, led by Proportional Message. The completed Induction to Pedagogy Programme for Parents will be available in all partner languages in February 2022.

Digital Literacy Curriculum for Parents: This curriculum has been developed by CSI, Solution and The Rural Hub. It will now be tested by local experts before being translated in national languages and piloted in the 7 countries of the partnership.

Family Learning Toolkit: The toolkit is in development process in English and will be tested with representants of the target population before beginning the translation process. The final version of the toolkit will be available by the beginning of next year in all partner languages.

In-service Training Programme for Adult Educators: The training programme will comprise 21-hours of workshop-learning with an additional 29 hours of self-directed learning activities. These resources will also be tested with local experts in order to collect feedback before translating them to the languages of the partnership.
